We are determined to work with each situation as it arises. With the help of local elders, affected people, and the Spirit, we will make appropriate arrangements for safe meetings. This process can include risk assessments by professionals and restricted meetings. Much has already been done to aid in the safety of the fellowship. We will continue to go forward with this goal in mind.
